Search for important information on the media about the destination but don't necessarily believe all red flags.

ASK PEOPLE



I already told you not to believe all the media has to say. So who do you believe?

The people that had been there before, or have experienced what you're about to go looking for.

Find people on social media, one of the best way is to search for #hashtags of the destination on Instagram, connect with people from there and ask relevant questions.

Also, Read blog posts, reach out to the bloggers, this way you get fresh information.

If you have friends or relatives in the city, ask for recent news and updates in the city. This way you know what to expect in terms of security.





ENDEAVOUR TO NOT GET INTO A NEW CITY AT DARK HOURS

Not every city operates round the clock like Lagos and Abuja. It is highly advisable not to have such presumption.

It's advisable to get to a new city as early as possible so you don't wander about in unfamiliar zones.

Even though, sometimes this might be out of your control due to some unforeseen circumstances. If it's really late and you don't have a host to come get you or a cab to your hotel. It's advisable you sleep at the park, it's safe there.

LISTEN TO THE LOCALS ON ANY WARNINGS, AND SAFETY ADVICE



Don't disregard the warnings of the Locals, they know better, they know where is dangerous and where is safe.

They are your ultimate guide to navigating the city, respect their opinions and yield to their advice.

Always remember; Your feedback/experience will influence so many peoples' decision, don't let your own ignorance ruin their hopes.

If we live in fear in our environment, we will never get to see the world. So stay positive, stay courageous, trust your instincts and take a leap of faith.



How to travel on a budget

Have a set budget

The first tip is to figure out your budget.

Take some ample time of yours to estimate the cost and check if it's way out of your budget or at par. Do you have enough to go on this trip? what will it cost you? How do you want to go about the necessities?

- Going by air: Search in Incognito mode, and compare different airline to help decide which one suit your budget.

Find a host/Free accommodation

Exploring Nigeria, accommodation consumes up to 60% of any travel budget depending on your choice of accommodation.

Finding hosts/locals in your city of visitation will save you a lot of money.

HOW TO GET A HOST



#1.Ask family and friends

Don't underestimate the power of networking, you don't know who your friends/family know in this world. They might be of help for the provision of free accommodation.



#2. Ask your online friends/ announce on your platform



#3.Couchsurfing

Mind you this is not as effective in Nigeria as it is in other countries. I only tried this once or twice in Enugu and Imo state.
You might just be lucky to find a serious host.

Tips:

- Don't share too much information except you're sure you'll be staying over at this person's place.
- Check reviews, profile thoroughly before engaging in a chat with anyone on the app.

Social media is a great tool, use it well. Are you traveling to Kano and you need a host? Ask on your media platforms

E.g: Anyone in Kano/ or have anyone living there kindly notify and I will be in your Dm.

You never know who might be ready to help

Tip:

Don't share too much information except you're sure you'll be staying over at this person's place.

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Travel to multiple states at a time

There are states that are easily explored on a trip.

Joggling two or more cities/States on a lengthy trip saves lots of money and time. Research for states that are in the same regional zones. Some of the states are selected in these guides, to help you plan and save cost.


Avoid traveling during Peak/Festive periods


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Travelling through Lagos

- Transportation: There are commercial buses called Danfo, keke napep(Tricycle) to get you around.
- There is Uber, Taxify and Yellow cabs available in the city.
- Google Map: is your best guide around the city.

 Motorbikes were recently banned from the city.

IF YOU ARE JONNY JUST COME (JJC) I.E NEW TO LAGOS

- Always bargain the price no matter how expensive or cheap the price might sound. Trust me, you can still get that stuff for less.
- Obey traffic/road rules: LASMA are everywhere, they will use you for food especially if they find out you be JJC.
- Always have cash in small denominations popularly called "Change" when using public transport.
- If you don't know your bus-stop; Ask the person sitting next to you or tell the conductor. Remind them always
 - Be Sharp/Stay Woke: you gotta stay smart in Lagos, don't dull and don't loose guard

BADAGRY SLAVE TRADE MUSEUM

Badagry heritage museum: This is a museum that houses artifacts and historical records of Badagry people. It's dated back to the time of the pre-slave era, slave era and the post slave era.





Why you should visit this Attraction:

It's one of the most detailed museums that talked about the slave trade era.

LOCATION: Badagry about 65km from Lagos central Ikeja.

Even though it's going to be heart wrenching exploring and listening to the pains of the slaves. There are couple of fun things to do at the attraction.

- Take a boat cruise to Gberefun Island.
- Have a horse ride at the beautiful beach.
- Take really amazing pictures at the beautiful old state of the art first storey building in Nigeria.
- Go to the fishing market in Badagry.

Things needed on this trip

- Cash at hand: for there are no ATMS littered around the city.
- Handkerchief; I won't promise you, that you won't shed a tear, so have your handkerchief with you.
 - Camera: The sky in Badagry is always blue, you need your camera to capture great moments

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KALAKUTA MUSEUM

This was home to the legendary Fela Anikulapo Kuti .

The museum is a fiveroom guest house, coffee and a souvenir shop.





Fun things to do at the museum

Experience and learn the history of the legendary Fela Anikulapo Kuti from the well trained and educated guides at the attractions. I am keeping the history short on the guide because it will be better to hear it from the horse's mouth.

- Take amazing pictures in and around the museum: they are certain sections that photographs are prohibited.
- Relax at the rooftop bar: The rooftop bar is an added advantage to the experience at the museum, dine and listen to some Fela classics.
- Interact with the guides: you'll be amazed at what they have to gist you about, their work, more enlightened story of Fela and a fun time with them. Some will go as far as singing some of their favorite Fela singles or you request for yours.
- Shop for souvenirs: shop for some handcrafted souvenirs and also mugs, tshirts, books and old Fela Musical albums.



3 Jakeal house , Railway Museum

The Ebute metta Museum is an historical site that preserves some of the old carriage wagons and some trains dated back to 1902.

The Jaekel house is about 100years old and was used by the first General Manager of the Nigerian Railway. It presently houses photos that simultaneously tell the story of the Nigerian Railway since inception and also the economic history of Nigeria.

My experience at this destination is one to remember for a long time.

The old man who happens to be our guide was so accommodating and knowledgeable about the history of the destination that gave me so much chill to want to grow old to be a museum guide myself.

It's a must visit for everyone.

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FUN THINGS TO DO AT THE MUSEUM

- Take a walk around the beautiful architectural building of the old house while you listen to the history of the railway station and see some old train remains.
- A tour of the Train station burial ground; Noo, this is not where people are buried. It is where old ruins of the first set of trains in Nigeria are kept; it is an aesthetic location for some nice photographs.
- Photo session around the vicinity; Jakeal house has really nice cultivated gardens, flowers and nature. It's the perfect place for a destination wedding.

 I had pictures from different angles in this destination that can last me a year if I decide to post everyday.
- Seat and chat on the designed train funnel in the garden.



THINGS NEEDED

- Your phone: I can't over emphasize on this enough, make sure your phone or camera is fully charged, you don't want to risk a low battery. So it doesn't end in premium tears if you are visualizing in retrospect about the pictures you could have taken instead of really capturing the moment.
 - Cash: just enough to get you around.

PARKS AND RECREATIONAL CENTERS

PARKS IN LAGOS

In 2018, Lagos state government paid optimum attention to the growth and development of the tourism sector which led to more establishment of parks and recreational centers, well equipped, easy to access, beautiful and almost free for everyone.

Few of the parks that are the rave of the moment and a must visit for everyone are;

LEKKI CONSERVATION CENTER

You'll be shocked at the number of people in Lagos that haven't been to this attraction before and they don't know what it offers. If you're a non-Lagosian u will find this place worth while.

Lekki conservation centre (LCC) is one of the popular nature conservation in Nigeria built-in 1990 by Chevron Corporation and currently being run and managed by the Nigerian Conservation Foundation to help protect the flora and fauna of the Nigerian ecosystem.

The centre covers an estimated 78 hectares of land. The reserve has a scintillating view of lush greenery, wetlands and boulevard of palm trees offering a picturesque sight.

The tranquil environment is really therapeutic, a good place to relax from the hustle and bustle of Lagos.

And an additional N1,000 to go on the canopy walkway.

THINGS TO DO IN LCC

- Take a Walk on the Canopy Walkway: LCC houses the longest canopy walk in Africa, the 401-metre long canopy walk is suspended at a height of 22.5 feet above the ground. The Canopy walk offers a panoramic view of the whole nature reserve and an up close experience of Nature. It's quite an adventure climbing the canopy walkway and you'll be glad you did.
- Play board games such as chess and Ludo on the giant painted board games in the floor:
- See the oldest 98-year turtle as well as other Animals such as monkeys.
- Relax/ have a picnic at the Gazebo: The shed made of raffia is a cool place to relax, rejuvenate, and recover your strength.
- Take a long walk at the garden while you rejuvenate and enjoy the greenery nature.
- Climb to the top of the Wood House: the woodhouse is another adventure next to canopy walk. You climb your way to the top of the house to have a view of the centre and to relax. It's a beautiful view up there especially at sunset.
- Take a walk to the Koi and tilapia fish.

LUFASI CONSERVATION CENTER

This is the second nature reserve in Lagos. LUFASI is a short accronomy for Lekki Urban Forest and Animal Sanctuary initiative.

Lufasi is an urban forest park that sits on 20 hectares of land.

The Centre provide a meeting point for nature and leisure walk, outdoor sports, field research, school excursions, wildlife rescue & rehabilitation and also a natural wellness centre.

Travelling through Ogun state wasn't a strange at all, I mean I've lived here, my secondary school was in the state and I lived here shortly after university. I know my way around and I can tell you Ogun state is one of the peaceful, affordable, lively and entertaining cities you can live in. Everything soft like I like to call it, not really for the hustlers but if you want to flaunt on a budget, choose Abeokuta.







GET TO KNOW OGUN STATE

Ogun is a state in the southwestern part if Nigeria. It was carved out of the old Western State of Nigeria and named after the Ogun River which runs across it from North to South. It was created on the 3rd of Febuary 1976.

LANGUAGE

The majorly speaking language is Yoruba. Ogun state is one of the Yoruba dominated states in Nigeria.

THE PEOPLE OF OGUN

Ogun State people are predominantly the Egbas, Ijebus, Yewas, Remos and Aworis who belong to the main Yoruba ethnic group. It also has sub-groups, namely, Ketu, Ikale, Ilaje, Ohori, Anago and Egun. There are also significant numbers of Nigerians from other parts of the country as well as foreign nationals.

GETTING INTO OGUN STATE

Ogun state borders Lagos State to the south, Oyo and Osun states to the North, Ondo State to the east and the Republic of Benin to the west.

What you need to know;

- You can only get into Ogun State by Road via the use of Public transport or private cars
- There is no Airport in the city, hence you can't get into the state by air.
- Its about 2hours drive from lagos, 1hr58 miinutes drive lagos, 2 hours from Oyo, and approximately 2hours from Osun state.
- Transportation is relatively cheap and prices varies from 1,000 to 2000 from lagos depending on your location

If you're travelling to the state from Lagos, then it's advisable to make a day trip instead.





Take really amazing pictures of yourself and the attraction.



Be a president for a day: have a sit on the presidential seat the president used during his regime as the president of the country.

Take a visit to the E-library, here you can study and also purchase some educational items within the premises.

THE ENTRANCE FEE

It cost N5000 per person to access the museum

The tour of this particular museum alone is a 2hours experience within the museum alone.

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A TOUR OF THE WILDLIFE PARK:

The wildlife Park is a menagerie of fauna.
Highlights of the Zoo's collection are lions, spotted and striped hyenas, a Marabou Stork, pythons and a striking aviary that houses several species of fowl.

IT COST N500 TO GAIN ENTRANCE TO THE PARK.

THE BAMBOO GROOVE AND THE GRILL BAR:

Families on holidays can also stay while enjoying the amusement park and other tourist attractions of the complex-wide tour and Presidential Library.

The Resort is made up of 153 rooms/suites. It has a swimming pool and a gymnasium. Guests can be treated to steam baths, sauna and body massage.

For the young and playful, the Lounge 45 bar and nightclub offers a vent for the release of nervous energy.

The resort has special packages for different classes of clientele and tourists and businesses have a place for their events.



The Kemta adire market is by far one of the best adire markets we have in the western part of Nigeria and also one of the most sought after attractions in Abeokuta, Ogun state.


The recently renovated adire Market is more than a shopping complex but now a beautiful picturesque attraction.


Over the years, the palace has gone through some renovative phases but preserving a section of the cultural value which is now a monument and museum worth exploring.

The Centenary hall

Located opposite the Ake's Palace, the Centenary Hall in Ake's area was constructed in 1950 to commemorate one hundred years of peace in Abeokuta since the last inter-tribal war.

The hall has pictures of past kings of Egba land

Take as much as pissible pictures as you deem fit.

Bilikisu Sungbo Eredo

The name 'Sungbo' is attributed to an Ijebu noblewoman named Oloye Bilikisu Sungbo who according to legend and myth has it that she was actually the Queen of Sheba according to biblical and Quranic accounts.

She was a wealthy and industrious widow who was greatly revered by her people, Oloye Bilikisu Sungbo built this monument as a personal memorial. It is located in close proximity to her grave.

It was said that Oloye Bilikisu Sungbo essentially ordered this to be built as a monument for her greatness because she was childless and, in traditional society, a child is seen to be the ultimate preservation of her legacy. Because she didn't have a child, she wanted something built as a reminder of her stature as an accomplished woman.

THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW BEFORE HEADING HERE

No woman is allowed to see her grave; history had it that Biliku Singh also known as the Queen of Sheba placed a curse that no woman should come an inch to her grave after her departure. The myth has it that they didn't help her when she was sick and plagued barren.

Only men are allowed to go closer to the grave because they were the only one that helped her during her sickness.

Any woman that attempts to gatecrash faces the consequences. It rumored that you won't be able to see your monthly circle, be barren or be lost without traces

Why should I go here as a woman?


- Even though women are not allowed to see her grave, Approximately located from her grave is the "Sungbo" which is an impressive hand-built system of defence walls dating back to around the year 1,000 and located just an hour's drive from Lagos.It's said to be Africa's biggest monument 2nd to the wall of China. A walk into this deep forest is said to be unraveling.
 - The best time to visit Sungbo's Eredo is during the dry season.

 Avoid visiting during Easter-time, as this is when pilgrims flock to the area to pay tribute to Bilikisu Sungbo.
- The best way to access this destination is to go through the Ministry of Tourism in government house, Abeokuta. because the attraction is almost impossible to discover without the guide of the locals, ministry or people who have been there.

THINGS YOU NEED FOR THIS TRIP

- A loose, comfortable clothing and walking boots because the trail leads deep into the forest.
 - Your phone and camera





The Oyan River dam was constructed in 1979-1983, the 11km height and 27km length was constructed to provide water for Ogun state and Lagos and also for Electricity supplies for the people of Ogun state.



AGEMO FESTIVAL

This festival is considered very important to the ljebu because it is believed that during this period, any barren woman that prays to the deity for the fruit of the womb always gets pregnant and eventually blessed with children. This is aside from the period being used to pray for peace and prosperity of ljebu Kingdom.

OJUDE OBA FESTIVAL

10-15TH NOV

This festival is celebrated by the Ijebu's in Ijebuland, it is an annual event which indigenes congregate at the palace of the Awujale (king) for a carnival-like celebration.

The glitz and colour associated with the festival place it among the most famous cultural festivals in the country. All of ljebu's sons and daughters always look forward to this event. It comes up on the third day of the Eid-el-kabir celebration

LISABI FESTIVAL

A Festival of Liberation for Egba Indigenes Lisabi Festival is an annual celebration of freedom from oppression and slavery as achieved by Lisabi Agbongbo akala, a warrior, who fought and rescued them from oppression in the 18th Century.

AFRICAN DRUMS FESTIVAL

The African Drums Festival is an annual festival that take place at june 12 Cultural Center in Kuto, Abeokuta.

The festival showcases various African Drums (including the tallest drum in Nigeria - 16 feet), drummers, dance troupes and singer

OSUN OSOGBO GROOVE

This is a world UNESCO site dedicated to Osun, the Yoruba goddess of fertility. The area was established more than four centuries ago and it is the largest surviving sacred grove. The groove was preserved by Susan Wenger an Austrian that had an encounter with the river god and the rest is a history you need to hear about by visiting the groove.

The Osun Osogbo grove also includes an art village with tie and dye, paintings, wood carvings, drums and other arts and crafts.

The Osun River is known to be one of the important rivers in Nigeria history and culture. The fertility god also called Yeye Osun is celebrated every August where all the indigenes of Osun states and foreigners converge at the groove and Osun River to celebrate the river goddess.

It's one of the beautiful festivals to experience in the state for its colorful, historical, cultural performances and exhibitions.

HOW TO GET THERE

From the popular park in Osogbo city or anywhere around the town, tell a bike man you're going to the Osun Osogbo groove. It's a popular attraction in the state and everyone is familiar with this site.

THINGS TO DO AT OSUN OSOGBO GROOVE

- Listen to the history of the groove and its relation to Susan Wenger from the well mannered, trained and educated guide present at the groove.
- Take a walk to the Osun River and enjoy its calmness: it's presumed that if you pray beside the water and take some portion of the water home with you, all your prayers would be answered and that it also possesses some healing powers. This might be of interest to you, so remember to go with a water bottle.
- Take a walk on the shaking bridge: it's called the Bridge Gada. You'll experience the bridge like it's going to crumble and you're about to fall into the stream down below, don't be scared it's a thrilling excitement.
 - Tip: it's fun to do it with a large number of people because it makes it more fun and shaky.
- **Take pictures at the groove**: There are a lot of sculptures all around the groove from beautiful to scary looking creatures, but they are all picturesque in a way. Take a lot of it to keep your memory there alive.
- Shop for souvenirs: There is a mini art and craft store where you can buy some indegionous items that are significant to the Osun culture. Some really nice handcrafted beads, woven bags and mat, calabash and all whole lot more. Have a look inside and make your choice.

SAFETY RULES

- Don't go beyond the demarcation of the river Don't go swimming in the river.
- Listen to the strict warning and guidelines of the groove.
 I hope you have an amazing visit here.

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THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW BEFORE EXPLORING OSUN OSOGBO GROOVE

- There are tour-guides available at the attractions and it attracts a fee.
- Taking pictures with mobile phones attract a fee of N200.

 No usage of professional cameras, however you can still bargain your way with this. Tri
 nice and all smiley, You can also tell them you're making a research for a course and pare evidence that you did visit the site (don't tell them I told you).
- On your way to the River Osun you may or may not be stopped by the guardian of the this woman might foresee a revelation that might forbid you from going close to the river.

This happens in 1/10 chances but if it does, please listen adhere to their warnings for your safety.

There is a demarcation at the river, kindly don't go beyond that.





SUZANNE WENGER'S HOUSE

One of the most historical and cultural heritage sites that depicts the history of Osun Osogbo groove is the Sussan Wenger's house.

This house was where Susanne Wenger lived from 1958 until he death in 2009, has a beautiful brazilian architectural building that was an important page in Nigeria's architectural history.

The house is still erected till today and it's been managed and occupied by her adopted children, priest and the artist "Sangodare Ajala", Chief Priestess Adedoyin Talabi Faniyi, all reside in the house.

This residence contains over 400 works of art. Most pieces are from artists Susanne Wenger traditional artefacts and also the New Sacred Art Movement Susan's Wenger was known for her incredible work of arts, masks and ritual objects.

Part of the building was dedicated to immortalizing Susanne. This part of the building remained untouched and tampered. Furthermore, the room at the third floor was said to be Susanne's living quarters and studio during her time as a resident.



- The fall is in the seventh stage and you can hike up to the seventh stage.
- Note that the waterfall only fall gracefully from stage one and stage two and the rest of the levels are hiking exercise
- Right at the seventh stage is a small town called Efon-Alaaye in Ekiti State, which means you've hiked your way up to another state

 It takes about 3hours to and fro to hike from the bottom of the falls to the Seventh stage.
- The hiking is best done in groups or with friends

 If you're a solo traveller, you'll definitely meet a lot of people at the attractions,

 feel free to approach them to have this amazing experience together.
- Proffessional cameras attract an additional fee of N2000
- There are tour-guide available at the fall, but you can explore Stage 1& 2 withouth the need of a guide.

- Enjoy the beautiful waterfall, swim at the bank of it and you can also hike right up to the falls in Level one and two.
- Enjoy nature as you sing, taking in all the fresh air and peaceful scenery the attraction has to offer.

OONI OF IFE PALACE

The Ooni is the biggest ruler of the Yoruba Land because Ile-Ife is where it's said that the Yoruba's also called Oduduwa originated from

The Ooni palace is built with royalty, class, and state of the art designs that made it one of the best, most historical yet modern and civilized palaces in the western region of Nigeria. The architectural design of the wall plated with gold and painted all white is one to look out for during your visit to Ile-Ife in Osun State.

The Ooni of Ife Oba Adeyeye Enitan Ogunwusi, Ojaja II(Kabiyesi) is an educated man whose love and interest in tourism is so glaring that he made his palace open for visitors year in year out.

MOREMI STATUE (MOTHER OF LIBERTY)

The story of Queen Moremi, is one that can never be forgotten in the Oduduwa history of Yorubaland.

Queen Moremi, statue is about 45 feet high and the third tallest statue in Africa. Moremi's statue of liberty was unveiled by the Ooni and according to Ife folklore,

Queen Moremi saved the ancient Yoruba town of Ile-Ife from raiders. It is said that Moremi gave up herself to be captured by the raiders so she could spy on their secrets.

After Moremi learned about this secret in captivity, she escaped and returned to Ile-Ife, where she told her people that fire was the bane of the raiders, hence the peculiar torchholding in all her statues. Late last month, the Ooni of Ife decided to pay homage to one of his ancestors.





The festival showcases various African Drums (including the tallest drum Nigeria - 16 feet), drummers, dance troupes and singer







TRAVELING THROUGH KANO STATE

GET TO KNOW KANO STATE

Kano is the capital of Kano State, It is located in the Northwestern region of Nigeria. It was created in 1967 and one of the largest Hausa Kingdoms in Africa that is currently 1000 years of age based on an ancient settlement around Dala Hill.

Kano is the commercial Centre of Northern Nigeria and the second largest state in Nigeria.

THE PEOPLE OF KANO

The principal inhabitants of the city are the Hausa people. However, there are few who speak Fulani language. As in most parts of northern Nigeria, the Hausa language is widely spoken in Kano.

THINGS TO DO HERE

Learn about the history of the palace and their culture from the guide assigned to you.

Take pictures: the Palace is beautiful and is a media worthy destination.

Interact with the locals as well as sharing a moment with the palace guards: this might be the coolest experience of your day, for they are quiet, chatty and accommodating.

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW ON HOW TO ACCESS THE PALACE

To access the Palace you need to talk to the palace security guards. There are always guards at the entrance of the palace.

They are easy to approach. Approach them with a welcoming smile and state the reason for the visit.

You need to state your intentions for your visitation before you will be granted access to explore the vicinity. Just be honest as much as you can about yourself. e.g I'm a tourist from Lagos and I'm here to see the beautiful Emir Palace of Kano. Trust me it's easy to win their heart that way.

Learn to greet in Hausa: Speaking a little Hausa like Sannu, is a plus to winning their hearts. They see it as an extra effort from your end.

If the Emir is not around, you will not be allowed to go into the Palace premises which means you can only explore the vicinity of the palace. Mainly the outside attractions.

DALA HILL

This is an historical site of the first settlers of the people of Kano. Before Kano was created it was formerly called Dalla. It was named after this hill.

It is 534 metres (1,753 ft) high, there are steps to climb to get to the top of the hill. It's a three hundred and and fifty step (350) hill. Don't be scared about the number, it's quite easy to climb.

The hill is a beautiful center point of Kano where you can see the beautiful landscape view of the city of Kano. The breeze at the top of the hill is one that will make you feel sleepy and love nature.



54 KANO CITY WALL

This is one attraction I am super proud about during my trip to Kano state. An attraction in its glory, with its historical and cultural values still kept intact even with the emergence and existence of civilization and how structured Kano state has become over the years.

I actually don't have issues with constant modern renovations /maintenance of historical sites but please don't tamper with its main essence. I love the way the ancient walls of Kano are being maintained.

The wall was initially built from 1095 through 1134 and completed in the middle of the 14th century


This is a UNESCO world heritage site. it served as a






This is definitely one attraction you shouldn't miss out on your exploration up north, if you do then you haven't been to kano because this was where it all started.



This is a destination most tourists from all over the world often visits. Interestingly, they still use the same methodology that was used in those days.

Ironically, today, Kasuwar Kurmi appears to be the sanctuary for Kano cultural heritages. It is what could be described as the repository of the state's artifacts.

It begins with prayers, followed by a parade of the Emir and his entourage on horses, accompanied by music players, and ending at the Emir's palace.






GET TO KNOW PLATEAU STATE

GETTING INTO JOS

There are three ways to go about getting into Jos

BY AIR:which is about an hour twenty minute with Arik air which runs a day domestic flight from Lagos to Jos and back.

The Jos airport is located some 30 km from the town so it is best to have some money for a taxi fare to town (generally about \#2,500).

By Road: Which is approximately 17 hours from Lagos.

There are several buses that operate from Lagos to Jos e.g Cross country and also the Plateau line government owned bus.

- It's advisable to break your trip to Jos because some logistics companies might not be going to this destination directly fro Lagos.
- It's preferable you take a bus to Abuja and take a 5hrs connecting bus from Abuja to Jos..

TRANSPORTATION COST

The bus prices vary from N8,000 to N10,000 depending on which transport company and what time of the year you are traveling .

Tip: it's advisable not to travel during festive periods in the state or in the country.





- Also Shere is best explored in groups/help of local guides, you might miss your path during this hike. Please make sure you have a local guide that knows this route for your own safety.









Taraba state is the dream of every explorer in this country. ask me why? Taraba State is the home to beautiful landscapes, mountainous, waterfalls on the scenic and prominent Mambilla Plateau.

The Mambilla Plateau has an altitude of 1,800 meters (6000 ft) above sea level and has a temperate climate all year round and I call it is the most beautiful destination in Nigeria.

Taraba state which capital is Jalingo is in the Northeastern region of Nigeria, it was created in 1991 out of the Gongola State







WHERE DO PEOPLE GO TO EXPLORE IN TARABA?

Ans: Mambilla Plateau
The plateau is Nigeria's northern continuation of the Bamenda Highlands of Cameroon, it has an average elevation of about 1,600 metres (5,249 ft) above sea level, making it the highest plateau in Nigeria.

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WHY SHOULD YOU VISIT MAMBILLA?

If you're a lover of nature and you want to be surrounded by waterfalls, plantations, hills, amazing people.it has a lot of scenic views, mountain chains and the temperature is a breath of fresh air that is uncommon in many other parts of Nigeria



HOW TO GET TO MAMBILLA PLATEAU

This information you will never find on the media but trust me to provide you with first hand information that will help you have an amazing and stress free trip/experience.

There are two ways to get to Gembu

The most advisable one for non-adventurers like myself is to follow the Jalingo route.

From Lagos, Abuja or other zones in Nigeria, it's advisable you get to Jalingo first.
Let's plan this trip from Lagos, shall we?



LAGOS -JALINGO BY ROAD

Duration by road: 18hours 39mins

This simply means you can't proceed to Gembu on the same day. I.e you have to spend the night at Jalingo to continue the next day.

Jalingo-Gembu


Duration by road: 6hours 9mins

What this means is that it's a 2days journey from Lagos to Jalingo by road.

Also you want to set out as early as possible.

TRANSPORT FARE:

Lagos to Jalingo - N10,000 Jalingo to Gembu - N2,800



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Accessing Jalingo by Air

There Is no direct Flight from Lagos to Jalingo by Air.
There are two options you can choose from for a faster and more stressfree way to access this destination if you don't want to sit for long hours road trip to Taraba.

LAGOS TO JALINGO BY AIR

The only Option to get a flight from Lagos is to go via Yola

You can get a direct flight from Lagos to Yola which is about an hour 45minutes.

Flight Ticket varies from N23,000-N25,000 depending on the airline of your choice and season of trip.

From Yola: You can board a bus to Jalingo for another 3 hours 45minutes.

Then proceed for another 6 hours to Gembu.

That is approximately 11 to 12 hours from Lagos to Gembu, Mambilla Plateau using this option.

ABUJA TO JALINGO BY AIR

There's an Airport in Jalingo and it's about 10 minutes drive from the center of Jalingo.

The only popular airline that operate this route is called Overland airways. This flight cost N36,000 from Abuja airport to Jalingo Airport.

From Jalingo Airport to Gembu is approximately 6hours and some minutes

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


I personally explored Mambilla from Benue State, I had listed the top 5 states I need to explore and at the of my ressearch agoogle provided me with a faster route to get to Gembu from Benue state so I looked it up.

My 2cent

1: It is advisable you follow this route only if you find yourself in Benue. Not necessarily travel via this route for the sole purpose of getting to Gembu.

2: There is no direct bus to Gembu from Benue, this is more like a (jumping Danfo, Lagos Experience). Not all that stressful but if you can't follow the direction below, please proceed to Jalingo and from there continue to Gembu just as I've listed above.





I realized Makurdi to Gembu is a better option than heading to Jalingo first for about 8hours and then head to Gembu for another 6hours from Jalingo when I could easily access Gembu from Makurdi for just 9hours. So I took the road less traveled, asked various locals for directions until I got the perfect one for my trip.

BENUE TO GEMBU BY ROAD



From makurdi park, take a bus to Kastina Ala for N1500. It's about 2hours 50 minutes from Makurdi peace park.

From Katsina-Ala- You take another 6 seaters Cab going to Takum for a sum of N1200. That's about another 1hour 55 minutes because of the bad road.

From Takum you get another cab to Bali for N700 for another 2 hours 55 minutes.

Then from Bali you take your last bus to Gembu for another approximately 4 hours 30 minutes. Cost 1500 Total Amount spent on this trip was N4,900

(Please note these prices are bound to change and you can't get direct bus to this destination unless you follow this route)

THINGS TO EXPECT ON THE ROAD TO GEMBU

- -its a rocky ride: it's a snake like road from the bottom to the top of plateau
- -The road is still under construction, hence the bad road to Gembu
- -Its always cold during the ride: make sure you have your sweatshirt
- -You'll see a lot of friendly monkeys on your way to Gembu, it will be nice to have a banana at hand to add to your experience.
- -Linking from Benue; some of these cabs are not in good condition and it's usually four seated passengers at the back and sometimes three seated on the front seat. You can decide to pay for double seats at the back.

WHAT TO PACK ON THIS TRIP

- Your phone, and your gears to capture the beautiful Mambilla
 - Extra power banks because they don't have stable light at Mambilla
 - An extra extension box for your gadget because you might not be provided with one
- A sweatshirt: it's extremely cold all year round in Gembu. Make sure you go with a thick layered one.
- A boiling ring: for you'll need that hot bath trust me in a scenario where your hotel can't provide you with hot water when you need it but they will always provide some every morning.
- Few provisions: Food is a scarce commodity in Gembu except for Fruits, Indomie and tea. Every other meal is an apology.
- Cash: A lot of it, you'll be needing it. Gembu only has 2 Atms which are always overcrowded, you don't want to spend time you should be using in exploring at the ATM queue.
- Sneakers and socks : you'll be needing this for the rocky and dusty drive.


68 Gashaka Gumti National Park







Transportation in Gembu

The best way and only way to explore Mambilla is on a motorcycle. it's advisable to book a standby bike man for the duration you'll be in Gembu. Cost varies from 10,000-15,000 (for 2days) depending on the attractions you'd like to visit and how many days you'll be spending.

Accommodation

Accommodation are quite cheap in Mambilla ranging from minimum of N2,000 to maximum of N5,000.

Feeding in Gembu

The easiest meals to get in Gembu are Noodles, Suya and highland tea except you want to feed on Banana alone which is surplus and cheap at that part of the country.

There is no much food option to choose from in Gembu.
And oh! Noodles is expensive;
2noodles one Egg cost me N450


AMALGAMATION HOUSE

WOMEN WAR MEMORIAL MUSEUM

This museum is built in honor of the Aba women who fought against gender inequality in 1929. This museum housed the picture frames and the history of the Ibibio people.

It's beautiful and neatly maintained.

The protests of The Aba Women's Riots of 1929 broke out when thousands of Igbo women from the Bende District, Umuahia and other places in eastern Nigeria traveled to the town of Oloko to protest against the Warrant Chiefs, whom they accused of restricting the role of women in the government.

The Aba Women's Riots of 1929, as it was named in British colonial records, is more aptly considered a strategically executed anti-colonial revolt organised by women to redress social, political and economic grievances. The protest encompassed women from six ethnic groups (Ibibio, Andoni, Orgoni, Bonny, Opobo, and Igbo).


It was organised and led by the rural women of Owerri and Calabar provinces.

This is picturesque destination, the old architectural building is a beauty to behold




UTA-EWA BEACH

It's one of the top destinations in Akwa-Ibom. I will advise you not to miss it.



THE BRIDGE ()F N() RETURN THIS JETTY WAS FIRST BUILT IN 1795 BY THE EUROPEANS FOR THE PURPOSE OF CONVEYING SLAVES INTO WAITING SHIPS IN A JOR UNDERGROUND HOLDING COMPARTMENTS WHICH WERE USED IN STORING VERY STUBBORN SLAVES. THE COMPARTMENTS HAVE A CAPACITY FOR ABOUT 30 PEOPLE, BUT ABOUT 50 SLAVES WERE STORED THERE AT ANY GIVEN TIME. IT WAS NICKNAMED "THE BRIDGE OF NO RETURN" ECAUSE ONCE A SLAVE STEPPED ON IT HEY WERE NOT ALLOWED TO LOOK ACK AND THEY NEVER RETURNED DAY YOU CAN STEP ON IT, LOOK BACK ALK ON THIS BRIDGE AND RETURN. — 70 GOD BE THE GLORY — — HON, DIR AKIYAN MICAH UMOH

88 THE BRIDGE OF NO RETURN

At the bank of the Imo River estuary, a walking distance from the Amalgamation house and colonial offices is a jetty and a bridge designed to enable free movement to and from the river, to enable embankment into boats and canoes. This was the famous Bridge of No Return, a name given to it by the locals. Slaves were walked down this bridge to the canoes for onward movement to the slave ships that lay anchored at the middle of the high sea waiting for their human cargoes for onward journey through the Atlantic Ocean to the vast plantations in Europe and Americas. No slave that walks down the bridge ever returns and thus the name "Bridge of No Return".

THE GERMAN BRIDGE





Part of Idere Hills is being used for farming - cocoa, tomatoes etc but the whole terrain is being planned to become world class tourist sites.




